Medical Guidelines

The American Academy of Sleep Medicine and American Academy of Dental Sleep Medicine's Clinical Practice Guidelines state that oral appliances are recommended for anyone who is **intolerant of CPAP** therapy or who **prefers alternate** therapy.



Research Studies

Hundreds of studies have concluded oral appliance therapy effectively controls obstructive sleep apnea. Studies also show similar mean disease alleviation between oral appliance and CPAP therapy, resulting from higher rates of **compliance** with oral appliances.
